Volunteer Role: Assistant Directoire Technique

Purpose of the role

To shadow the main DT person and learn about DT in a working environment.

Training and support:

Scottish Fencing will then pair you with an experienced DT person as a mentor.
DT will be remunerated with either travelling expenses a drink and a snack and lunch if helping for a whole day. Where budgets allow cash or a bottle of wine (if O18) will also be used to show our appreciation.
