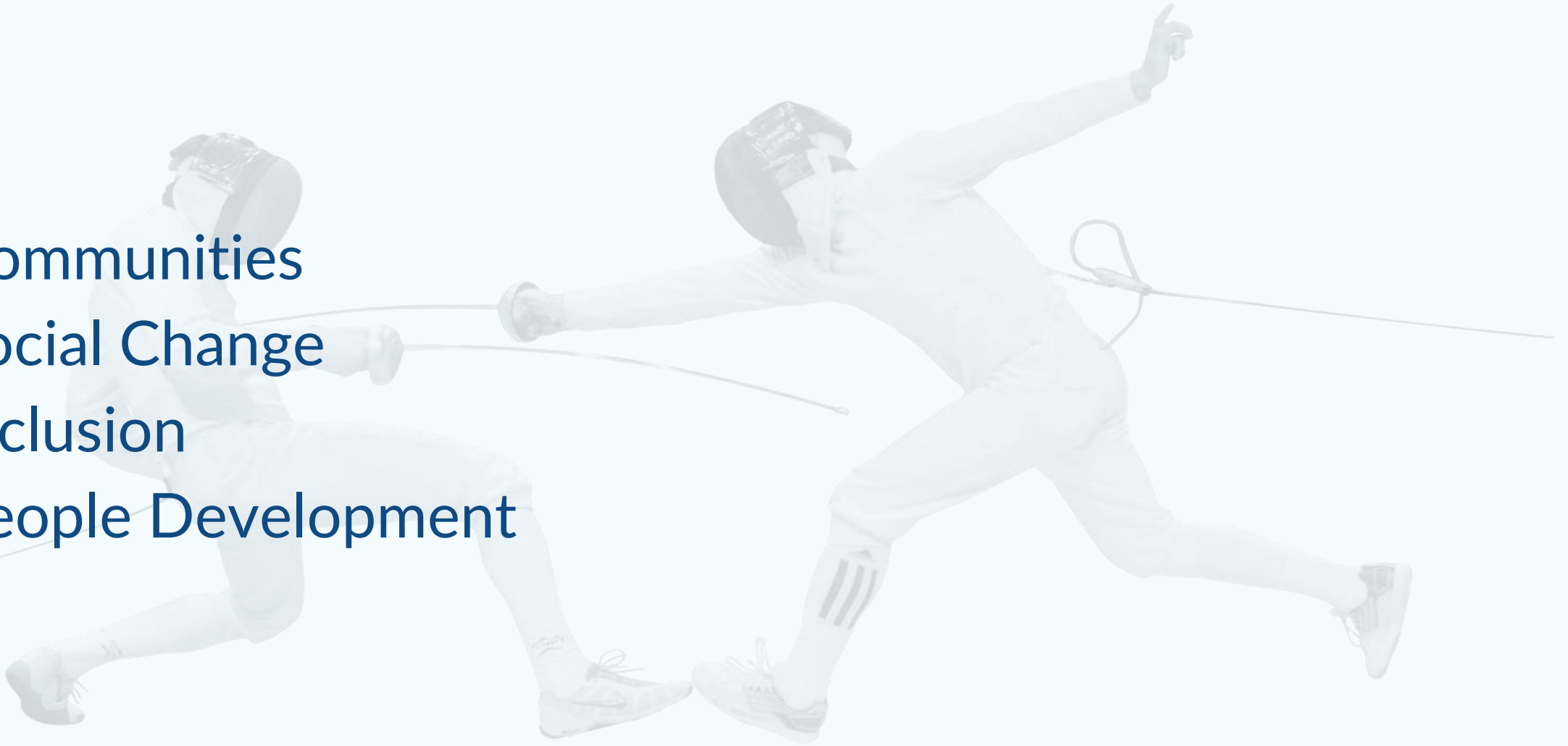
Events

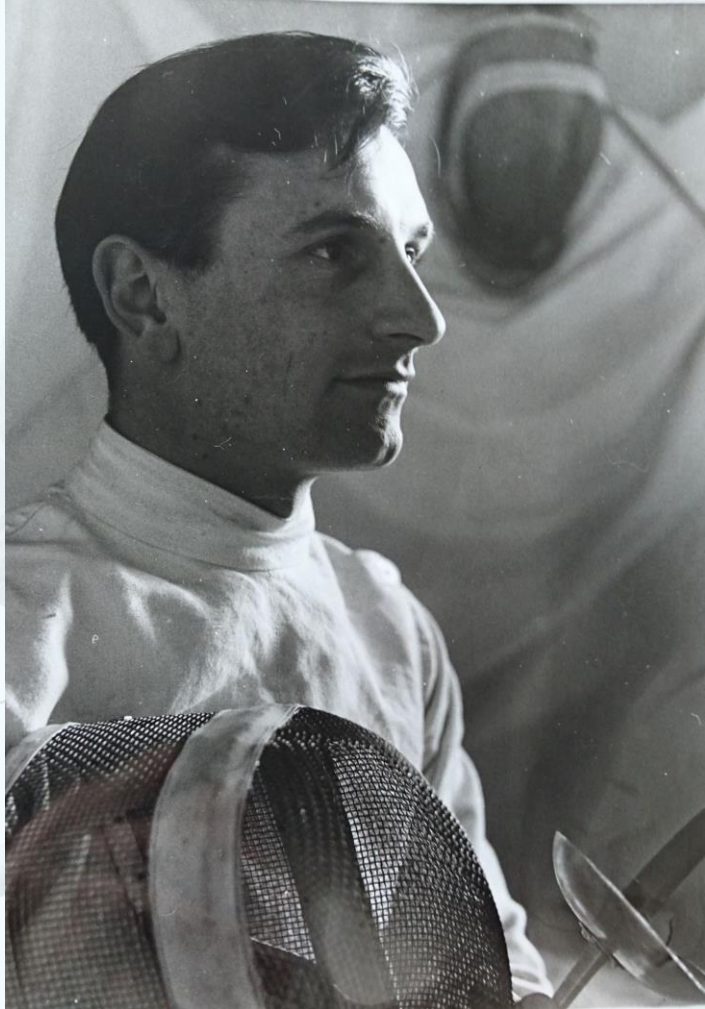
